Seventy-five percent of Canadians have been affected by bullying (Prevnet). Those numbers can be two to three times higher for kids with visible scars or disabilities, according to the U.S. National Center for Education.

Our FREE #CutTheBull presentation brings one of our patient ambassadors like Jeffrey, Saoud or Nia to your school/organization to share their life story and their bullying experience. Bullying: Resources

Bullying can take on many different forms and parents play an important role in preventing and stopping bullying. Children can rotate between any of three characters: the one being bullied, the one bullying and the one watching it all happen. Regardless of what role your child plays, if any, bullying has long-term negative consequences and must be challenged.
